

## Phillips' Announces Highlights from the London New Now Auction on 8 December

Showcasing Contemporary Artists Such as Michaela Yearwood-Dan and Doron Langberg, Auction Newcomers Including Francesca Mollet and Pam Evelyn, Alongside Masterworks from Günther Förg, Theaster Gates and Michaël Borremans

LONDON – 24 November 2022 – Phillips announces highlights ahead of the New Now sale in London on 8 December. The sale is led by Günther Förg and features a selection of works by contemporary artists including Caroline Walker, Sarah Ball, Kristy M Chan and Michaela Yearwood-Dan. Artists making their auction debut in this sale include Francesca Mollett, Pam Evelyn and Olivia Sterling. A series of works by German and German-speaking artists include an exemplary painting by Günther Förg, a work by auction newcomer Andi Fisher, as well as works by Gerhard Richter and Kiki Kogelnik. Further highlights include works by Theaster Gates and Michaël Borremans, among others. On view [online](#) and in Phillips' London galleries alongside the New Now highlights viewing from 1 to 8 December is [The Sovereign Art Foundation Students Prize Finalist's Exhibition](#). The New Now sale is comprised of 196 lots and will take place on 8 December at 1pm.

Celebrated artists such as Günther Förg and Theaster Gates will be shown alongside younger artists with rising markets such as Francesca

We look forward to welcoming visitors to view our auction highlights and the exhibition in person when Phillips' Berkeley Square galleries open on 1 December."

## German Speaking Artists

Leading the sale and painted in 2007, *Untitled* is a highlight of one of the last monumental series created by German artist Günther Förg. In a manner highly characteristic of his Spot Paintings, Förg here positions the viewer in front of a large off-white background filled with linear 'spots' almost rhythmically applied to the canvas and enhanced by a diverse colour palette of vibrant reds, blues, pinks, greens, purples counterpointed by deeper notes of browns and blacks. This rhythmic application allows for a brief sense of structure while leaving room for a deceptive simplicity that is once again done thoughtfully and purposefully by the artist. Further highlights from German-speaking artists include works from Gerhard Richter, Kiki Kogelnik and auction newcomer Andi Fischer.



## UK-based Contemporary Artists

Caroline Walker's *Overnighter* immediately transports the viewer into an intimate moment. Depicting a lone woman standing by a bed in the middle of the night, the present work asks the viewer to adopt a somewhat voyeuristic gaze. Positioned just off-centre with her arms crossed over her chest to maintain the warmth of a robe, we share a transitory moment with the figure. Walker leaves enough ambiguity and psychological space for viewers to imagine multiple scenarios and outcomes to her sumptuously painted scenes.

Yorkshire-born Sarah Ball's *Marie* stares at the viewer with a deep and intense gaze in her serene 2019 painting. Enhanced by rosy cheeks and thin, tightly pressed together lips, the figure's pale skin is strikingly luminous, framed by the thick fur coat wrapped around their head and shoulders to insulate from the cold. *Marie* is an arresting example of Ball's detailed portraits, in which she specifically explores the connections between the physical presentation of the self and traditional binary norms.

Further works by contemporary UK-based artists include Michaela Yearwood-Dan's *Love Letters to Siri no.2*, and Kristy M Chan's *Tristan and his video art collection*.

## Auction Debuts

Included among the artists making their auction debut in the New Now auction this December is British artist Francesca Mollett. Mollett's 2021 painting *Untitled (Surfacing)* is highly characteristic of her more recent work, visually dissecting the complex interrelationship between nature, the body and the mind. Building on her previous interrogations of abstract natural scenes, her current paintings intersperse visions of an observed natural environment in tandem with her own psychological musings. Drawn to abstraction as a way of dissolving boundaries between forms and creating space for emotional expression, Mollett's practice draws especially on the fluid, shifting, and transformative qualities of weather and water to striking effect.





## Contemporary Masterworks

A further celebrated contemporary artist whose work will be offered in the sale is Theaster Gates. Executed on a large scale, Gates' wall sculpture, *Topological Study with Hose*, is made up of decommissioned fire hose piping, sourced from Pell City, Alabama, in a direct reference to the 1963 Birmingham Campaign and civil rights protest led by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.. Gates also sourced the wooden frame from a school in the Dorchester area of Chicago which had been due to close, alluding to the widespread defunding of African-American urban communities in the wake of the 2007-2008 financial crisis. Gates's work has been presented in exhibitions in New York, Los Angeles, London, Paris, Shanghai, Milan and Chicago, with an exhibition most recently at the Whitechapel Gallery in London. His works have been acquired for major collections worldwide including at the Kunstmuseum Basel, the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, the Studio Museum in Harlem, the Tate and the Whitney Museum of American Art.

Further internationally renowned artworks include, among others, works from Michaël Borremans, Anthony Gormley, Keith Haring, Peter Halley, John Baldessari and Rafa Macarrón.
