

## PHILLIPS' NEW YORK PHOTOGRAPHS AUCTION ON 2 APRIL SHOWCASES ICONIC IMAGES BY RENOWNED ARTISTS

Sale to Feature Top Works by Richard Avedon, Irving Penn, Robert Frank, Hiroshi Sugimoto, Andreas Gursky, and Other Masters of Photographic Art from the 20th and 21st Centuries, Including Offerings from Esteemed Private Collections

NEW YORK – 24 March 2025 – On the heels of the record-breaking, white-glove auction, *Color Vision: Masterworks by William Eggleston from Guy Stricherz and Irene Malli*, Phillips is proud to present its spring Photographs auction, featuring several private collections and seminal individual works. The New York sale will take place on 2 April, following the public exhibition at 432 Park Avenue, open from 26 March to 1 April.

**Sarah Krueger, Head of Photographs, New York**, said, "After the remarkable success of our auction dedicated to the work of William Eggleston this week, we are thrilled to continue our strong spring season with a stellar variety of photographic work that celebrates the expressive breadth of the medium."

The top lot of the auction is the full suite of 11 photographs from Richard Avedon's 1978 portfolio *Avedon/Paris*. These classic fashion images created in the 1940s and 1950s for *Harper's Bazaar* and *Vogue* display the grace and sophistication that typified Avedon's work from this period. The photographs were selected in conjunction with Avedon's landmark 1978 retrospective at The Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Another fashion masterpiece from this period is Irving Penn's *Woman in Palace, Marrakech, Morocco (Lisa Fonssagrives-Penn)*, the photographer's exotic evocation of Mid-Century chic. The subject is his wife, Lisa Fonssagrives, one of the first supermodels, whom Penn depicts here as a mysterious and seductive beauty within a lavish setting. Originally published in *Vogue* in 1952 in an editorial entitled "Moroccan Handbook," Penn's image is as much an homage to his beloved wife as it is an embodiment of his own supremely elegant style.

Opening the auction is a selection of 20 classic photographs from the collection of noted philanthropist and collector Lois Zenkel (1936-2024). Ms. Zenkel was an early collector of photography and played an active

role in the foundational years of the fine art

photography market, astutely assembling a collection of classic images by 20th century masters, including Robert Frank's Parade - Hoboken, New Jersey, and Political Rally, Chicago, two of the best-known works from his landmark book, The Americans, as well as Frank's earlier, more romantic Tulip, Paris. Ms. Zenkel's primary focus was documentary photography, and her collection highlights signature works by Walker Evans, including Main Street, Saratoga Springs, as well as photographs by Brassaï, Henri Cartier-Bresson, Josef Koudelka, and others.



Phillips is pleased to present *Venus: A Private Collection*, a selection of sensual studies of the female form that includes Helmut Newton's *Sie Kommen (sideways)*, and classic photographs by such luminaries as Albert Watson, Herb Ritts, Patrick Demarchelier, Bruce Weber, and Arthur Elgort. This carefully curated selection of images showcases how each of these photographers channeled his muse, creating some of the most iconic images of their careers.

On offer are three large-format prints of Nick Brandt's incomparable studies of African wildlife, including the monumental *Elephant with Exploding Dust, Amboseli*. Brandt eschews the telephoto lenses that are the standard tools of the trade for photographers working in the African bush, favoring a simpler photographic rig that requires him to get closer to his subjects. This proximity, paired with his patience and sensitivity to the animal before him, results in photographs that are portraits of individuals rather than taxonomic documents.





The 2 April auction will also feature an offering from collector Alan Siegel, the legendary brand identity consultant, whose collection was celebrated in the 2000 book. One Man's Eye: Photographs from the Alan Siegel Collection. Selections include two of Robert Adams' best-known works, Longmont Colorado and Berthoud. Colorado, as well as Erwin Blumenfeld's sublime nude study, Back, Paris. Barney's gloriously pink-hued Jill and Polly in the Bathroom is

another highlight of this celebrated collection. Phillips is also honored to offer further property from the estate of dealer and collector Brent Sikkema, including two prime examples of Modern and Post-Modern photographic artistry in György Kepes' *Juliet* (with peacock feather and red concentric circles) and Gerhard Richter's Abstraktes Foto.

Photographer Bill Owens' deep dive into the American suburbs of the 1970s is collected in a suite of 117 images offered together. Originally published as a book in 1972, *Suburbia* became a touchstone of Post-War photography and exerted a significant influence on the current

generation of workers in the medium. Another significant compendium is Louis Faurer's *The LIGHT Suite, Philadelphia and New York*, a suite of forty images by the legendary street photographer.

Classic images include Edward Steichen's *Calla Lily* and *Diagram of Doom*, dating to the period directly after World War I when the artist began to explore an entirely new approach to photography. Walker Evans'

Allie Mae Burroughs, Hale County, Alabama is one of the definitive portraits of the Depression and illustrates his subject's pride and resilience in the face of profound privation. Julius Shulman's iconic image of Richard Neutra's Kaufmann House in Palm Springs is offered here as a stunning early print that captures this architectural icon in all its Mid-Century Modern glory.



Contemporary offerings include Hiroshi Sugimoto's unique *Brush Impression 0916 (Water)*, which demonstrates the artist's equal affinity for traditional Japanese calligraphy and the nuances of analog photographic craft. Also included are Thomas Ruff's immersive *Substrat 01* and Andreas Gursky's *Bremen, Autobahn*, the latter being sold by the Martin Z. Margulies Foundation, as well as a strong selection of work by Robert Mapplethorpe, David Wojnarowicz, Richard Learoyd, Edward Burtynsky, Anne Collier, Vik Muniz, and many others.
